

During July and August, John, Les and Mel will be spending time in Germany recording their new studio album which is scheduled for release in early 1983.


## **TOURS ETC**

#### A SMALL SELECTION OF FOBJH'S EXPERIENCES IN GERMANY

As indicated in the April newsletter I am printing some of the many letters I have received from FOBJH's who took part in the Frankfurt trip.

## Robert & Lynn Ironmonger of Devizes, Wiltshire

"I have only just considered coming down from cloud 9 after what must be considered an ultimate experience for any FOBJH. I refer, of course, to seeing the lads playing in Frankfurt. To begin with, there were one or two events which put most of us on a downer. Our coach got a puncture before we even got out of London! After changing coaches, we set off for Dover. We arrived around 1800 hours on the Friday. Next morning came and everyone was marshalled onto the coach, tickets given out and we arrived at the Festhalle at 1600 where queues were already beginning to form. A quick visit to the essentials at the Hauptbahnhof and back to the queue. Time: 17.30. Eventually the gates opened and we went in, found a good location and waited for the show to begin. I was so amazed at the sight of hundreds of lighter flames around me in the total darkness. lads came on and after the first number acknowledged the UK contingent. next two hours went by so quickly it was unbelievable. After they had gone fro the stage the crowd started shouting 'superband' and the UK contingent shouted 'more' (This raised an eyebrow from a German fan close by us!). What I thought was the highest accolade for any FOBJH was the dedication by John, Les and Mel of Hymn to the fans that went over to see them. After the gig we returned to the coach and that's when the third accolade was bestowed upon us. David Walker and Lindsay Brown personally represented the band to thank us for coming. The crowning glory of the evening for me was when all 3 members of the band autographed my jac ket. The trip home was extremely rapid (as all trips home are). Please extend the thanks from my wife and myself to John, Les and Mel for what has been the best experience I have ever been through".

## And from Steven Heap of Bardsley, Oldham

"Out of this world, excellent, brilliant - just a few words to describe the concert at Frankfurt. Anyway, the band played their best ever gig with tremednous lighting and great backdrops. They included just about everything they could play, and what a surprise when they played Child of the Universe and Mockingbird. Everything they did was really excellent, finishing off with a superb rendition of Hymn, with the crowd going absolutely bananas, it brought a lump to my throat. It's extra special when you come from Oldham as well. Other high spots were great renditions of Love on the Line, Sip of Wine, Loving is Easy, Play to the World, Poor Man's Moody Blues, the list is endless. Thanks BJH. The band also thanked the British fans for making the journed and dedicated Hymn to us, a great gesture. Also, thanks to David Walker and Lindsay Brown, the band's managers for coming to the coaches after the gig and thanking us for coming and for getting my Berlin album autographed. It really was a great weekend and I would like to thank the lads for making it so great and tell them to hurry and get playing Britain again".

## Finally, from Judy Bolton of Sheffield

"I apologise for the delay in our renewal, the reason for this was we were saving like mad for the German trip to Frankfurt. We are both unemployed so we sacrificed all pleasure of going out etc so we could go and see BJH in Germany. There were 2 coach loads of us and we all seemed to get on with each other straight away. The trip going to Germany was long and very tiring. We finally arrived at the Festhalle stadium. It was a huge place and even at this time the place was very packed although there was still another hour to go before the concert started.

Dave and I were down at the front. We got a very good view and managed to take quite a few photo's. I know you're not supposed to but when you've a boyfriend who follows everything BJH does and has every copy of albums done, it is hard to keep him at bay! When the lights went down it was lit up again with candles, lighters, sparklers etc. It was unbelievable to see this sight. The 'light' of the world or peace has a stronger significance than at home. I have never seen it done at home. Probably if it was the fire brigade would be on our backs. During the concert John gave an announcement that he and the band knew a hundred or so fans from England had travelled specially. He acknowledged us twice and the German people couldn't believe we'd come so far for a concert. The concert itself was great. The band seemed to put everything into every song, especially Berlin, Hymn and Mockinbird. After the concert the managers came to the two coaches and thanked us for coming as far as we did. They then said for us to elect one person to collect posters, tickets, records, etc for signature by the boys. David and I had the album Berlin autographed, together with 3 posters. Unfortunately our posters never arrived back, we are not quite sure what happened to them (Note, if anyone has these by mistake perhaps they would let me know -Chrissie) The journey home was speedier than the outward one and everyone slept. Someone had a cassette of the Berlin album so we listened to that too. Thank you for organising the trip along with Mead Gould. We really enjoyed it even though we were all very tired at the end of it. All Dave and I want now is to see BJH in Berlin. That would make us very happy. Thank you very much."

So it seems a good time was had by all and what a lovely feeling for BJH, knowing that so many of their loyal British fans had come along. They did appreciate it you know.
